Made from indigenous Saperavi grown in the upper part of PDO Mukuzani micro-zone vineyards at the right bank of Alazani River, Kakheti.

Black cherry and dark chocolate aroma with vanilla and hot spices tones. Corpulent and full with fruit tones, with strong tannins and extended taste.

History & Terroir:

GRW (Georgian Royal Wine) was founded in 2011 by the winemaker Revaz Karalashvili and his partner Gia Kupreishvili. The Karalashvili family has been working in the field of wine for the fifth generation. The vineyards are mainly in the Kvareli region in special micoro-zones, near the foothills of the Greater Caucasus Mountains. Better sun exposure and drainage on sandy & silt over clay soils result in bolder and spicier Mukuzani.



Vinification:

Handpicked. Fermentation at controlled temperature in stainless steel tanks. After ~14 days of fermentation, wine is racked clean and transferred for malolactic fermentation. Finished off in Caucasian oak barrels for 9 months.

Variety: Saperavi 100%

Residual sugar: 2 g/L

Serving suggestion and food pairing: Decant and serve at 17°C with lamb chops and pork, cheese and mushrooms lasagna, great with khinkali (dumplings) and khachapuri (cheese-filled bread).
