"Rich, concentrated and structured, this wine comes from 80-year-old vines grown organically and spent 24 months in wood. It needs to age, but already the black-currant fruit glows with crispness and acidity. Wood and tannins are still softening, so drink this wine from 2022."

Terroir:

The Dupuy vineyards occupy a 47 hectares surface which is composed of two châteaux : Beauséjour and Langlais. Located in the Saint-Émilion region, the town of Puisseguin produces only red wine. The terroir which is mainly limestone-clay soil is planted with three types of bordelais grapes. **The non-use of chemicals goes back to 1947. The soils have never been treated with herbicides or insecticides.** Vineyard Average Age: 80 years.



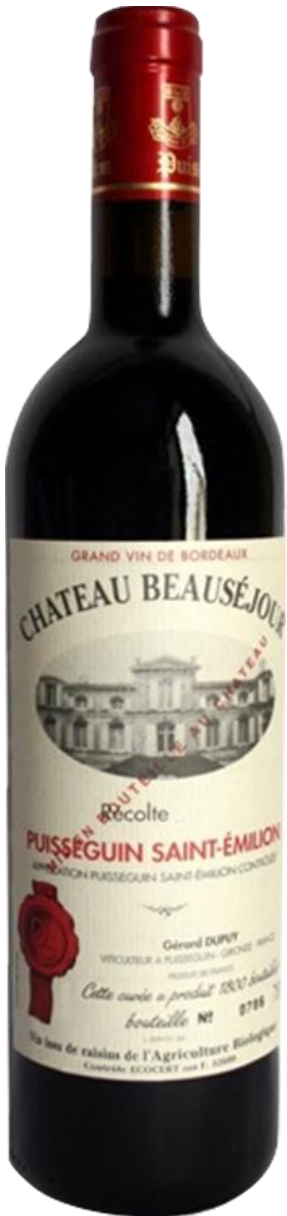
Vinification:

Vinification in Thermo-regulated steel vats. Vatting time 1 month, handpicked. 24 months in new oak.

Variety: Merlot 70%, Cabernet Franc 30%

Residual sugar: 5 g/L

Serving suggestion and food pairing: Serve at 17°C with red meat and matured cheeses.
